HOW DO YOU PRONOUNCE THRIANTA? It'S simple, just say TREE-AAN-TA!

THRIANTA OR SACHSENGOLD: The breeds are pretty much one in the same, as we must remember the Germans introduced Thriantas to improve the color of their Saschsengolds, then the Dutch re-introduced Saschsengolds into Holland and name them Thrianta. Thriantas, are bred more squat in build, slightly smaller in size, the color is more intense and carried well down the hair shaft. The Dutch prefer an ideal weight of 4 pounds. The Sachsengold, can weigh up to 7 pounds, has a yellow to orange coloring, so therefore not as intense as the Thrianta and it's standard calls for a lighter under color. It should be noted that the Thrianta is a Tan Pattern rabbit devoid of the black, blue, chocolate or lilac color.

THRIANTAS ARE A COLOR BREED, BUT ARE THEY CONSIDERED ORANGE OR RED? Often you will hear people say what a beautiful orange color the Thriantas have, well in human eyes, yes the color is orange. Those who exhibit small stock or any livestock for that matter, their beautiful orange color is known as red in the breed standards. SO, Let'S just call the color RED.

THRIANTAS IN BRIEF. The breed is unique with their fiery red-orange color, compact type, stout head and ears which are quite pronounced in the bucks. A 24 x 24 inch cage is ideal for their housing. They are good natured, but inquisitive. Does readily breed at 6 months and will average 4 to 6 in a litter and are good mothers. Seldom will you see white toenails or foreign spots in the coat. You can be assured that they attract a great deal of attention in the showroom whenever presented. The Thrianta is a HOT little rabbit in all respects and garners the title as a "FIRE OF THE FANCY".

THRIANTAS NORTHWEST!

The showing of Thriantas is just beginning in the Pacific Northwest. Two bucks were exhibited at Washington's Evergreen State Fair, where one mom daringly utilized one of them for the 4H "Novice Parent" Fit and Show Class. She didn't do very well, but that wasn't the Thrianta's fault – and the crowd enjoyed hearing about the breed!

Three Thriantas were shown at the Northwest Rabbit Breeder's fall show on October 2 in Monroe, Washington. Cindy Wickizer judged them and went over them very thoroughly. She described the difference between the "European" style of the Thrianta, as opposed to the Florida White, to which the Thrianta is always being compared, and showed the spectators how that breed is shown bunched up and rounded, but the Thrianta is not.

Other fall shows featuring Thriantas were the Tri Cities Rabbit Breeders show in Kennewick, and Puget Sound RCC in Bremerton. Winter and spring found the Thriantas at Mount Vernon, Kennewick, Yakima and around again to the fabulous Northwest Rabbit Breeder's spring show in Monroe.

So far it looks like there are six owners of Thriantas in this area, three of us in Western Washington, one in Eastern Washington and two in British Columbia. If there are more of you out there, send me an e-mail!
